Gage House provides high-intensity, residential treatment and is located at 1813 Holland Street in Erie.

Gage House offers a structured program that provides high-intensity services to individuals who are in need of treatment to address co-occurring drug and alcohol and mental health issues. The program is designed to provide individualized treatment on a voluntary basis and is licensed by the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs (DDAP) and the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services.

Professional Staffing

Our professional staff is experienced and trained in delivering services to the co-occurring participant. Individual treatment is under the direction of a psychiatrist and provided by mental health/drug and alcohol professionals. Staffing includes registered nurses, master's level therapists, certified counselors, certified recovery specialists, and trained technicians/aides in the addictions field.

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Co-Occurring Program



Gage House offers 3.5 level of care

For those who meet criteria for co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders

TREATMENT 21-90 DAYS (as clinically indicated)

- Education about both mental health and substance use disorders
- Medication management through weekly psychiatric intervention
- Family education and family therapy
- Relapse prevention and skill development
- Recovery programs
- Group and individual therapy
- Referrals for additional needs such as case management services, employment, education, medical care, budgeting, and housing assistance
- Medication-assisted treatment (MAT), including Vivitrol and Suboxone
- MAT maintenance for methadone
- Education on lifestyle changes

Continuing Care and Follow-Up

Aftercare starts the day of admission. Referrals to necessary services are made during treatment such as peer support services, case management, and mobile psychiatric rehabilitation.

These referrals are identified through the treatment process in order to support ongoing stability, growth, and recovery after discharge.

Clients are encouraged to learn more about available community supports.

Coverage and Costs

Gage House accepts private insurance and Medicaid. Individuals without the ability to pay or without insurance coverage, may be eligible for county-assisted funding.

This project is made possible by an agreement with the PA Department of Health, Department of Drug and Alcohol, the Erie County Department of Human Services, and the Office of Drug and Alcohol Abuse.





What to bring

- Personal hygiene items Including: soap, deodorant, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb/brush, razor, shaving cream, and female hygiene products *No aerosol cans, glass bottles, or items containing alcohol*
- Recovery support materials Examples: AA/NA books, pamphlets, and religious texts
- Prescribed medications
 - Clothing for 5-7 days Laundry facilities are available on-site All clothing must be appropriate—no promotion of drugs, alcohol, violence, negative slogans or graphics. No A-frame T-shirts or revealing clothing. Shorts and shirts must be of appropriate length and size. Appropriateness will be determined by staff.
- Store-bought, unopened cigarettes.
 No vaping, cigars, rollies, or chewing tobacco.
- Safe is available on site for wallets, cellphone, etc.

What not to bring

- Cars Bicycles
- Suitcases
- Over-the-counter medications
- iPods, CDs, or CD players
- Hairspray, nail polish, or perfume/cologne
- Food (meals and snacks will be provided)
- Bedding (blankets, pillows, and towels are provided)
