What Is Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)?

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) is a proven, effective approach to treating opioid use disorder (OUD) and alcohol use disorder (AUD). MAT combines FDA-approved medications with counseling and behavioral therapies to support long-term recovery. At the Stairways Drug & Alcohol Outpatient Clinic, clients who engage in the MAT program also complete a comprehensive substance abuse assessment and are concurrently enrolled in either Level 1.0 (regular/maintenance) or Level 2.1 (intensive outpatient) services at the clinic.

Benefits of MAT:

- Reduces cravings & withdrawal symptoms
- Improves survival rates
- Lowers risk of relapse & overdose
- Helps patients regain control of their lives
- Supports whole-person recovery

MAT Medications Offered at Stairways:

- Naltrexone (Vivitrol) – providing induction, maintenance, tapering, discontinuation
- Buprenorphine (Suboxone, Sublocade, Brixadi) – providing induction, maintenance, tapering, discontinuation
- Methadone – counseling services provided while coordinating ongoing care with an established Methadone provider

Funding Options:

- CCBH of Erie and other medical assistance plans
- Medicare
- Most major commercial insurance
- Financial assistance available for eligible clients
- Self-pay options on a sliding scale based on income and other factors
